CALL FOR PAPERS

We are happy to announce that the 18th Annual Conference of the International Association for Comparative Mythology is to be held at <u>Seoul National University</u>, Republic of Korea, on **June 2-5**, **2025**. The conference is organized by the IACM in collaboration with Center for Folkculture Studies, Institute of Humanities, Seoul National University, Republic of Korea. All members are warmly invited to present papers and to participate in the discussions.

The conference will be held in a hybrid format allowing presentations either inperson or virtually via Zoom. The final day of the conference (June 5, 2025) is planned to be entirely online to accommodate most virtual presentations.

CONFERENCE TOPICS

This year we are focusing on the following areas:

- 1. *Connecting with Non-Human Worlds*, including but not limited to the following sub-topics:
 - Mythological and folk representations of interactions with spirits, demons, semi-divine beings, and animals;
 - Communication with gods;
 - Interactions with the neverworld and the realm(s) of the dead, including *katabasis*.
 - Methods of interacting with non-human worlds: pathways to other realms; communication approaches and languages of these domains, etc.

- 2. *Mythology and Folklore of Korea and Eurasia*, with a special emphasis on
 - Korean mythology, folklore, and ritual practices;
 - Korean materials from a comparative perspective;
 - Mythology, folklore, and cultural interactions across Eurasia.
- 3. *An Open ("Free") Topic*, i.e., any other topic you would like to propose/choose for your paper will be considered.

Additionally, we are inviting contributions to two **special panels** (note that panel submissions bypass the standard selection committee and are evaluated directly by panel organizers):

- 1. *Using Data and Sources for Mythology Research*. The panel is organized by Nataliya Yanchevskaya and will include 3-4 papers. When submitting abstracts for the panel, please consider addressing these subtopics:
 - Ethical considerations in source selection. Should we exclude certain data sources?
 - Using potentially unethically sourced data and its implications for research conclusions;
 - Critical analysis of how different schools within comparative mythology approach data sources;
 - Computational and mathematical methods of data analysis in the study of myth.
- 2. *Modern Political Uses of Mythology*. This panel, organized by Steve Farmer, will include 3-4 lectures. Before writing a formal abstract for this panel, feel free to <u>email Steve</u> to discuss potential ideas for your talk.

Examples of a few of a wider range of possible topics include:

- The deep biological and/or cultural roots of modern hypernationalist and authoritarian mythologies;
- How premodern mythological and religious views affect modern political decisions involving migration, misogyny, racism, and genocide, etc.;
- Novel uses of large language models or other computational tools in studying the modern political uses or abuses of mythology.

Please indicate if you would like to present your paper in person or virtually. The abstracts will be reviewed by a selection committee; the selected abstracts will be published on our website (<u>http://www.compmyth.org</u>)

PAPER LENGTH

Each speaker will be allotted a 30 min. time slot. The expected paper length is 20 minutes plus 10 minutes discussion. The language of the conference is English.

CONFERENCE FORMAT

While the conference will be held in hybrid format, we hope that most participants will be able to come this year in person; however, we will also accept a limited number of papers to be presented virtually by Zoom and will allow virtual participation of the audience. Most of the papers presented virtually will be scheduled on the last, 'online', day of the conference.

CONFERENCE FEE for the participants from North America, Australia, Northeast Asia, the EU and EEA countries, UK and Switzerland <u>participating in person</u> is **\$150 (KRW 216.000*)**, which will cover the conference dinner and reception. Students from the aforementioned countries and participants from other regions can participate for a reduced fee – **\$75 (KRW 108.000*)**. <u>Virtual participation</u> fee is **\$15**. Scholars from Ukraine can participate in the conference **free** of charge.
